When to deworm:

You should begin deworming your foal at 6-8 weeks of age and every two months thereafter for the first 24 months of its life. Treatment should be based on the time of year and the age of the foal. After 24 months, horses can be dewormed every three months. Some adult horses may require more often due to population and environment of housing.
